# CALL BEFORE YOU CUT

**Removing any tree with a trunk 8" in diameter or larger may require a permit!**



## Permitting Process

Removal of any tree or vegetation that has a DBH (diameter at breast height) of 8" or more on private property, or of any DBH on public property, is regulated and requires a permit. Requirements are not intended to restrict property owner's rights or preempt state statutes.

Trees listed on the Atlantic Beach Prohibited Species List are not regulated and are exempt from mitigation.

## Fees

Application fees are due with the application, amendment, extension, re-inspection, or appeal.

Category	Fee
Tree and vegetation removal permit application fee:	
a. Single- or two-family residential uses (per lot)	\$125.00
b. Multifamily residential, commercial, industrial, institutional, or other	\$250.00
Extensions	\$50.00
Appeals	\$125.00
Variances	\$300.00
Reinspection fees	\$50.00
Research or extensive time fees (per hour)	\$50.00

# Mitigation

Unless payment into the Tree Conservation Fund has been approved, *tree replacement, relocation or preservation are the preferred methods of mitigation*. Mitigation is assessed such that the number of inches removed are proportional to the number of inches replaced, relocated, or preserved.

## STANDARD MITIGATION ASSESSMENT (ratio is inches removed: inches owed)

Classification	Category of Regulated Tree			
	DBH less than 14"	DBH equal to or greater than 14" and less than 30"	DBH of 30" or greater	Heritage Trees
Vacant lot	1:0.5	1:0.5	1:1	1:2.5
Developed lot	1:0.5	1:1	1:2	1:3
New construction	1:1.5	1:2	1:3	1:4
Public property	1:1.5	1:2	1:3	1:4
Environmentally sensitive areas	1:2	1:2	1:3	1:4
Historic corridor	1:2	1:2	1:3	1:4

## Tree Replacement

- To receive mitigation credit, replacement trees must be on the Atlantic Beach Recommended Species List.
- New oaks must replace removed oaks.
- New palms may replace removed palms.
- Designated Maritime Species trees must be replaced by Designated Maritime Species, not limited to the same species.
- When a Designated Maritime Species is removed, at least 25% of mitigation must be provided in the form of replacement.




# Minimum Replacement Requirements

- **Residential:** One 4" caliper tree planted/preserved per 2,500 sq. ft. of parcel area (1 shade tree must be in front yard. A 3-palm tree cluster may replace a single shade tree on oceanfront lots)
- **Commercial:** One 4" caliper tree planted/preserved per 8,000 sq. ft. of parcel area
- **Industrial:** One 4" caliper tree planted/preserved per 10,000 sq. ft. of parcel area
- **Public/semi-public (government or institutional):** One 4" caliper tree planted/preserved per 10,000 sq. ft. of parcel area

## Tree Protection

Protective barriers around preserved trees and signage must be placed prior to commencement of construction and shall be constructed in accordance with Section 23-32(c). Any planted/preserved tree that dies within 3 years must be replaced by the owner.



## Permit Exemptions

A permit may not be required in the case of the following:

- Emergency situations
- Safety hazards
- Diseased, infested, or invasive plants
- Utility or city crew operations
- Surveying or engineering access needs

Owners claiming any exemption have the burden of proof and verification by a certified arborist may be required.
